Tackling challenges in an evidence-based way


The Austrian Institute of Economic Research (WIFO), founded in 1927 by Hayek and von Mises, is Austria's leading institute for applied empirical economic research. It bridges the gap between academic research and economic policy application, offering high-quality research and policy advice. WIFO conducts empirical analyses using advanced methods and communicates results through publications, reports, and public relations.

International orientation

WIFO is part of an international scientific network and regularly works on international research projects, for example for the European Commission or the European Parliament. The continuous exchange with the European scientific community and decision-makers is central to WIFO's bridging function.

Independence and research integrity

WIFO is committed to taking an independent position on economic policy issues, which is ensured by a broad range of supporting institutions with different interests and tasks. In accordance with its statutes, WIFO has a public mission and does not aim to make a profit. WIFO's work is generally published. WIFO is a member of the Austrian Agency for Research Integrity (ÖAWI) and observes the rules of good scientific practice in order to ensure the integrity and traceability of its research results.





Comprehensive research on issues of relevance for the economy and society

WIFO is unique in Austria because it covers almost the entire spectrum of economic research. Five Research Groups covering different areas of economics collaborate in research projects on relevant challenges.

Detailed models for the analysis of micro-, macro-, regional and environmental economic issues complement the profound econometric know-how. Extensive experience in handling complex data as well as detailed knowledge of the institutional foundations of national and international economic policy ensure a high quality of research.

WIFO data system

WIFO provides current key figures on economic developments in Austria and abroad in an easily accessible form within the WIFO Data System (WDS). The WDS imports and homogenises various data sources from Austria and abroad and prepares them for the use in scientific analyses and economic policy decisions.

Public relations to introduce facts into debates

The aim of WIFO's public relations is to make the Institute's research results accessible to as wide an audience as possible in order to feed the results both into the design of economic policies and public debates. Especially in times of "fake news" and "alternative facts" empirical research is more relevant than ever to contribute to evidence-informed economic policies and enable evidence-based decisions. Thus, the detailed and professional response to international and national media inquiries is an integral part of the daily work of WIFO researchers.

WIFO increasingly uses digital channels for its information activities, such as the Institute's website, regular newsletters and social media.
